**NOVENA TO THE DIVINE MERCY
STARTS ON GOOD FRIDAY AND ENDS
ON THE 2ND SUNDAY OF EASTER,
DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY.**

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT:

HOLY WEEK CELEBRATION:

FROM THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER AND THE BISHOP'S OFFICE:

1. **PALM SUNDAY CELEBRATION WILL BE DONE IN THE PARKING LOT.** 50 people will be allowed (not in cars) as well as 50 CARS ARE ALLOWED WITH FAMILY BUBBLE INSIDE. No more than 50 vehicles are allowed in the parking. People who attend in their vehicles must stay in their vehicles and tune in to this FM radio frequency 99.10 to listen. COMMUNION WILL BE DISTRIBUTED during communion time. Palms will be distributed after the Mass by the ushers. Do not approach to get the palms.
2. People who will not bring their cars can either stand or can bring their chairs. PLEASE FOLLOW PHYSICAL DISTANCING OF TWO METERS.
3. **SINCE DR. HENRY ALLOWED INDOOR CHURCH GATHERINGS FOR FOUR DAYS ONLY BETWEEN MARCH 28 TO MAY 13,** THE BISHOP SUGGESTED THAT WE CHOOSE THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM (HOLY THURSDAY, GOOD FRIDAY, HOLY SATURDAY) AND EASTER SUNDAY TOO SINCE THE DIRECTIVE MIGHT CHANGE ANYTIME DEPENDING UPON THE RISE OF THE CASES in the province. 10% CAPACITY OF THE PLACE IS ALLOWED OR 50 PEOPLE INCLUSIVE OF THE PRIEST AND MINISTERS. TWO EXTRA PEOPLE ARE ALLOWED TO SERVE AS USHERS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER.
4. There would be pre-registration online on our parish website BOTH FOR INDOOR GATHERING. FOR OUTDOOR (for people who will not be bringing cars) MUST ALSO PRE-REGISTER ONLINE for contact tracing and to manage the attendance numbers
5. FROM PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER, anyone over 70 or WITH UNDERLYING CONDITION IS CAUTIONED AGAINST ATTENDING AND NO ONE LIVING WITH A PERSON WITH COVID or who has any respiratory or flu-like symptoms should NOT ATTEND BOTH INDOOR AND OUTDOOR GATHERINGS.
6. FACE COVERINGS ARE MANDATORY AT ALL TIMES, INDOOR AND OUTDOOR. HAND SANITIZING IS A MUST. FACILITIES USED SHOULD BE SANITIZED.
7. A CHOIR IS NOT ALLOWED, HENCEFORTH NO SINGING EVEN WHEN RECORDED-SONGS ARE PLAYED.
8. PARISHIONERS MUST NOT GATHER OR SOCIALLY ENGAGE WITH OTHER PARTICIPANTS BEFORE, DURING, AND AFTER THE CELEBRATIONS.
9. PARTICIPANTS MUST DISPERSE IMMEDIATELY AFTER MASS, AND MUST NOT CONGREGATE WITH OTHER PARTICIPANTS.
10. FOR THE INDOOR CELEBRATIONS, THOSE WHO CANNOT BE ACCOMMODATED INSIDE CAN TUNE IN TO THEIR CAR RADIO USING 99.10 FREQUENCY AT THE CHURCH'S PARKING LOT. 50 PEOPLE ARE ALLOWED OUTSIDE AND FIFTY CARS (FAMILY BUBBLE) ARE ALLOWED TOO AT THE PARKING. COMMUNION AT THE PARKING WILL BE AFTER THE CELEBRATIONS.

Encounter St. Kateri Tekakwitha Retreat

Celebrate with us the feast day of St. Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680), also known as Lily of the Mohawks, the first Indigenous saint of North America. St. Kateri converted to Catholicism at age 19 and, after refusing to marry, moved to the Jesuit mission at Kahnawake, south of Montreal. There, she lived a life of prayer and asceticism. Following her death, many miracles and supernatural occurrences were attributed to her. She was canonized in 2012. In Canada, her feast is celebrated April 17.

This weekend retreat—April 16-18th—will focus on the relevance of St. Kateri's spirit today, her relationship with our Creator God and the gifts of creation. Our facilitator is **Sr. Kateri Mitchell**, SSA, a Sister of St. Ann who was born and raised on the St. Regis (Akwesasne) Mohawk Reservation in upstate New York, southern Ontario and Quebec. She has been a teacher and school administrator, worked full time in several forms of Indigenous pastoral ministry and served for 20 years as executive director of the international Tekakwitha Conference dedicated to evangelization among Indigenous peoples. Sister Kateri has been an advisor to the Vatican and the American bishops on Indigenous ministry and interfaith affairs. She was appointed as the first North American Indigenous person on the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue.

Responsibilities • Clean washrooms, dust all surfaces, clean glass windows and surfaces, dry mop or vacuum all floors and remove garbage and recycle items from Parish buildings. • Ensure that the sacristy and church (e.g., pews, floors) are clean at all times. • Maintain the carpets and hard-surfaced floors periodically. • Perform and/or report necessary repairs. • Keep all equipment in good working order. • Coordinate periodic fire inspections. • Maintain the grounds, lawns and flowerbeds as required. • Clear snow and ice from sidewalks and walkways and maintain the spring, autumn and winter checklists required by the diocesan insurance policy. • Arrange for power sweeping of parking lots and line painting if required. • Maintain the cleaning supplies inventory and order supplies as needed within the approved budget. • Update and maintain records contained within the diocesan “Arson Risk Management Compliance Declaration.” • Provide other duties as required.
