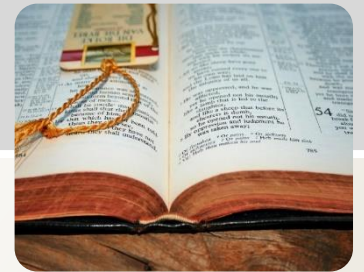

British Columbia Bishops' Campaign in Support of Healing and Reconciliation

The Catholic bishops of British Columbia recognize the need for a province-wide initiative to raise funds to support healing and reconciliation among Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. This appeal will launch formally in September 2021, at which time further details will be provided.

Campaign Priorities

The goal of the Campaign is to support residential school survivors and Indigenous communities in our province as part of our ongoing response to the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action. This includes projects that promote healing and reconciliation.

As part of this process, each bishop will consult with Indigenous leadership, survivors, elders, and other community members.

The bishops of British Columbia sincerely hope that this Campaign will help to restore trust and further the ongoing journey to truth and reconciliation.

STEP 3 RE-OPENING GUIDELINES FOR PARISHES

1. Please stay home if you are sick.
2. Masks are no longer mandatory, only strongly recommended, especially for all people 12 years and older who are not fully vaccinated.
3. No more social distancing but please respect one another's personal space.
4. Hand sanitizing is still necessary.
5. Holy Communion will continue under one species, the Body of Christ.
6. Communion at the parking lot will continue for those who are not able to attend indoor mass.
7. Mass continues to be live-streamed for the 10am Sunday Mass *only*.
8. Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation: until everyone has had the opportunity to be fully vaccinated, the dispensation will remain in effect. Nonetheless, everyone is encouraged to return to in-person celebrations of the eucharist as soon as possible.
9. Holy water fonts remain empty for now.
10. For the time being, church doors will be locked manually after celebrations for security reasons.
11. The parish office is now open to the public. Social distancing, hand sanitizing, mask protocols should be maintained for the time being.
12. During office hours, the church doors are kept locked for security reasons. Please knock at the parish office door if you have business with the parish secretary.

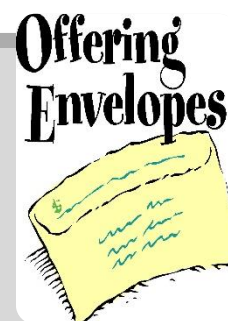

Custodian Position Description

(Diocesan Employment Policy for Lay Employees)

This is a part time job – 3 HOURS/WEEK

Summary Reporting to the Pastor or his designate, the Custodian maintains the church and Parish centre and associated grounds. Basic Position Description: To clean and maintain the Parish buildings and grounds. Duties and Responsibilities • Clean washrooms, dust all surfaces, clean glass windows and surfaces, dry mop or vacuum all floors and remove garbage and recycle items from Parish buildings. • Ensure that the sacristy and church (e.g., pews, floors) are clean at all times. • Maintain the carpets and hard-surfaced floors periodically. • Perform and/or report necessary repairs. • Keep all equipment in good working order. • Coordinate periodic fire inspections. • Maintain the grounds, lawns and flowerbeds as required. • Clear snow and ice from sidewalks and walkways and maintain the spring, autumn and winter checklists required by the diocesan insurance policy. • Arrange for power sweeping of parking lots and line painting if required. • Maintain the cleaning supplies inventory and order supplies as needed within the approved budget. • Update and maintain records contained within the diocesan "Arson Risk Management Compliance Declaration." • Provide other duties as required.
